WHAT IS 3D PRINTING?

3D printing is the process of making a three-dimensional object from a digital computer file. The printer receives the information from the digital file and then builds the object layer by layer using a thermoplastic material,

3D PRINTER POLICY

All Selover computer and network policies apply to the use of the 3D Printers. This policy is subject to change without notice.

- I. The public will not be permitted to use the printers to create material that is:
 - A. Prohibited by local, state, or federal law.
 - B. Unsafe, harmful, dangerous or poses an immediate threat to the well-being of others.
 - C. Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the library environment.
 - D. In violation of another's intellectual property rights. Printers will not be used to reproduce material that is subject to copyright, patent or trademark protection. (It is the responsibility of the patron to verify the eligibility of the item to be printed.)
- II. Selover Library reserves the right to refuse any 3D print request.
- III. Only designated library staff will have handson access to the 3D printers.
- IV. The library is not responsible for the subsequent safety of any item made with the 3D printer.
- V. Requests will be honored on a first come, first served basis and as time allows. Priority will be given to Selover Library cardholders.
- VI. Mass manufacturing, or printing multiple copies of the same file, is prohibited without prior approval.
- VII. Items that are not picked up within 14 days will become the property of Selover Library.
- VIII. The library does not guarantee a successful print. Staff will not try to print an object more than twice. Unless the print fails to finish, the cost of the completed print, regardless of quality, will still be charged.

Cura print preparation software is typically used with both printers.

Free 3D print designs are available from Thingiverse.com, youMagine.com, and many more sites. Or create your own design with software such as SketchUP or Tinkercad.

Patrons must design, create, or download their own models for use on the 3D printer; librarians are available for assistance only.
